Choose Food2Soil If



Quantity Of Organic Waste

Your household fills one 5 gallon bucket (give or take) with organic waste every week.



Placement & Size Of Collection Container

You prefer collecting your organic waste in a small bucket or caddy which you can empty into a larger container that is shared amongst several homes/neighbors in your community.



Access to Finished Compost

You want the finished compost made from your scraps to use in your garden, and, to be provided to local farms and growers to grow food.

Choose Waste Hauler If



Service Is Free

Your waste hauler provides organics recycling at no cost.



Quantity Of Organic Waste

Your household fills up two or more 5 gallon buckets with organic waste every week.



Placement & Size Of Collection Container

You prefer collecting your organic waste in a 32 gallon (or larger) cart placed in your garage or backyard. The cart is emptied every week from the curb, along with your trash (black) and recycling (blue) carts.



Access to Finished Compost

You do not have a garden and aren't interested in receiving the finished compost.
